



Project Update

**CAUTION: CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES OCCURRING 24/7
ALONG THE LILLOOET RIVER FSR**

KM	Activity along the Lillooet River FSR
KM 33 – 35	Ground works (including blasting) up the hill side to support pole installation.
KM 38.5	Concrete works at the Boulder Creek HEF Powerhouse. Tunnelling continuing at the Boulder Creek HEF. Blasting will occur daily.
KM 38	Caution: High traffic area at the entrance to the Camp Road (Pebble Mainline).
KM 38 - 42	Concrete Truck will be hauling day and night from KM 37.5 along the FSR and turning into the two powerhouse locations (i.e. KM 38.5 and KM 42). Drive cautiously in this area.
KM 39.5 Athel Main	Construction of the Boulder Creek Intake Access Road and Crane Pad along the Athel Main Line Road. Blasting will occur daily. Hauling of material from the Intake area to KM 0 of the Athel Main. Day and night shifts working.
KM 39.7	ROAD CLOSED from Thursday September 11 at 5PM to Friday September 12 at 5 AM to replace a log box culvert.
KM 41 – 42	Stringing of the transmission line conductor. Concrete works at the Upper Lillooet River HEF Powerhouse.
KM 42	Trailhead and parking to the Pebble Creek Hot Springs has been relocated from KM 43.5 (Truckwash Creek) to the Liíwatátkwa7 (Lillooet River) Trail and Parking area at KM 42 along the Lillooet River FSR.
KM 48	Construction activities at the Upper Lillooet River HEF intake. Blasting will occur daily. Day and night shifts working.
Road Name	Activities associated with Transmission Line (not along the Lillooet River FSR)
Lillooet South FSR	Road building up Branch S200 road at 2 KM Lillooet South FSR. Road upgrade of the Lillooet South FSR near completion.
Ryan River FSR	Bridge installation completed. Active hauling for 1-2 weeks.
Salmon Main	Right-of-way clearing continues at the end of the Salmon Main Road.
Pemberton Creek Main	Road upgrade works and right-of-way clearing.

Lillooet River FSR - general updates on other industrial users

- Processing logs and active hauling along the Lillooet River FSR and spur roads.
- Pumice trucks hauling daily.
