# Project Update

Construction activities are resuming in accordance with the post-wildfire re-assessments of avalanche, landslide and rainfall criteria where qualified professionals have outlined mitigation measures and procedures that must be followed to ensure the safety of construction personnel. The Project Site is being monitored and assessed on an ongoing basis by the qualified professionals.

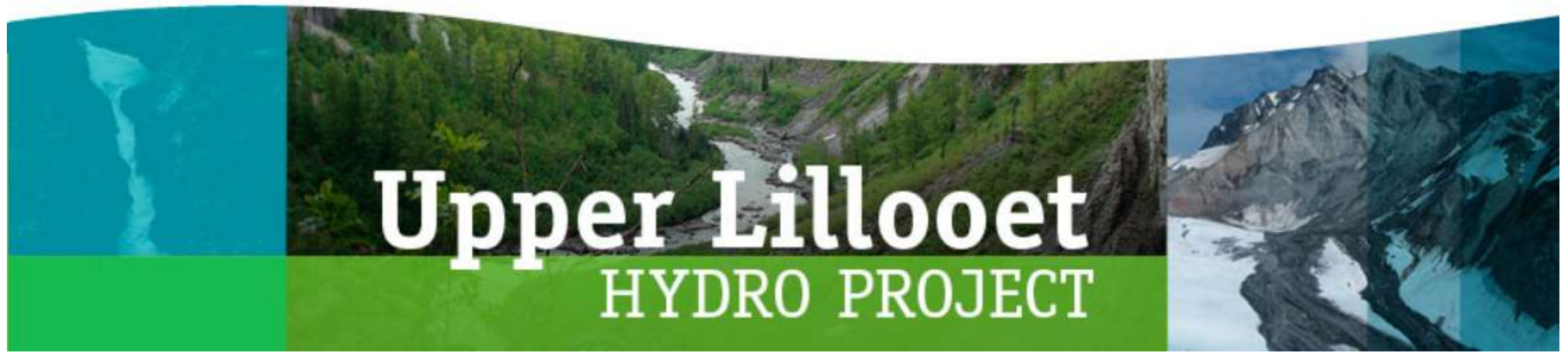

KM 37.5	Area Restriction Order in effect - Check Point Booth is in place 24 hr/day
KM 38.5	Tunnelling at the Boulder Creek HEF. Blasting will occur daily
KM 40-41.5	Slope stabilization measures being implemented along/above the Lillooet River FSR
KM 41.2	Upper Lillooet River HEF Powerhouse site open
KM 42	Lillooet River Trail <b>CLOSED</b> until danger tree assessment is completed
KM 42-44	Upper Lillooet River HEF Penstock works ongoing
KM 44	Upper Lillooet River HEF Downstream Tunnel Portal site open
KM 47	Upper Lillooet River HEF Intake and Upstream Tunnel Portal site open

Lillooet South FSR	Helicopter staging at KM 4.5 and equipment staging at KM 6 and KM 8 Please use caution in these areas.
Ryan River FSR	No activities at this time
Ryan South Main	Heli yarding commencing September 12 for approx. 5 days
Miller Bench FSR	FSR now <b>OPEN</b> - road construction and transmission line clearing starting next week
Pemberton Creek area	Pole installation to begin next week
